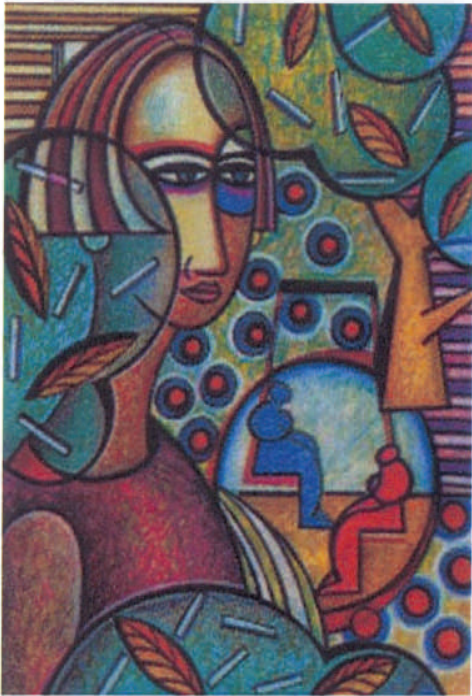

Finally, It's Justice for All!

Canada recently signed the UN Convention on the Rights of People with Disabilities. What does this mean? How is “disability” defined? What are the implications of this Convention for women or children with disabilities?

How far does the Convention go in addressing issues like autonomy, decision-making, poverty, accessibility? With 144 nations signed on, a new global understanding of inclusive justice is being forged. This talk explains the evolution of concepts of disability rights and explores the immediate practical use of these important innovative ideas in the lives of individuals with disabilities and their families.
